Starting with the leasing of an old turkey and broiler facility in Georgia, which we converted for breeder production and leased a chick hatchery in Arkansas.

In 1997 we acquired a chick hatchery in Bremen, Alabama, our current "South Central" Hatchery.

In 1998, after seven years of hard work with all the family members participating, we were able to take the next big step. We bid farewell to the old breeder facilities in Walton County and moved our business to what everyone saw today here in Oglethorpe County Georgia!

In 2000 we established a breeder pullet growing facility in the same county called "Omega Farms".

In 2000 and 2003 we acquired additional production facilities in Iowa and Pennsylvania, which were divested this past year in a move to strengthen our ability to continue to thrive as an independent family owned poultry business.

In 2005 we established a subsidiary "Tetra Americana". Led by our son Bastiaan we acquired exclusive representation for North- and South America of the Hungarian Breeding Company "Babolna Tetra".

In 2008 we acquired the assets of "PureLine Genetics" which focuses on the development of specialty products, mainly for the alternative poultry meat business.

In 2015, after Hendrix Genetics decided to go into direct marketing and we had to give up the distribution for the Bovans and Dekalb breeds, we had the opportunity to become the USA Distributor for the H&N "Nick Chick". It was one of the very first hybrid egg layers introduced in America almost a century ago. For several years H&N has been rather "dormant", but is now reemerging as a very good fit for the American Egg Farmers and the re-introduction has been a great success!"

Gijs Schimmel continued to say: "Many of you know the rest of the story. Yes, besides successes we also had to overcome many challenges and disappointments in the past 25 years! But every time we were able to turn a challenge into an opportunity! We are very thankful for that, and thank you for celebrating this occasion with us."

The highlight of the evening was the handing out of service awards. Besides all Centurion team members with over 10 years of service, some of the long time marketing team members were honored for being instrumental in a seamless transition from marketing the Bovans and Dekalb chicks to the H&N "Nick Chick" and keeping most of our customers while gaining many new ones.

Gijs Schimmel congratulated them with these word of appreciation: "Many of you know we do not always carry our "hearts on our lips". Today we surely want to make good on that! Not only by recognizing our team members, but by honoring the poultry industry which has made us successful and we want to give back! We want to share our successes with the less fortunate and in the same time support the poultry industry. In honor of the loyalty of our team members, we are donating \$25,000.00 to "Heart for Africa, Project Canaan", in supporting their efforts to expand their project to produce eggs for the needy in Swaziland.
